Imphal, the 10th November, 2022

No.57/3/91-For: In exercise of powers conferred under Section 32, 41, 42 and 76 of the Indian Forest Act, 1927 and the Rules made therein and in supersession of this Government Notification of even No. dated 24.02.2021, the Governor of Manipur is pleased to revise and amend the "Schedule of Rates of Royalty" and other payables on various forest produces leviable in the State of Manipur as follows with immediate effect and until further orders:

SCHEDULE OF RATES OF ROYALTY ON FOREST PRODUCE, 2022

59. All other tree species except the exempted Agro-forestry species coming from Non-forest areas/Private lands (Appendix), and not listed in the above list shall be categorised as and included in "C"-Class (Ucham Class) for all purposes.

- II. **Rates of Royalty:** "Royalty" means the rates of royalty prescribed in this Notification and revised from time to time by the Government of Manipur. The following Rates of Royalty shall be applied as per the schedule below:

a. **Timber and Round Logs (Over-bark Mid-Girth: 60 cm and above)**

- The volume of logs will be calculated by multiplying the square of the quarter girth taken at the middle of the logs multiplied by the length of the logs. Thus if 'L' is the length of the log in metre and 'G' is its mid girth in metre, then its volume is given by:

$$V = \left(\frac{G}{4}\right)^2 \times L \text{ m}^3$$

- The above rates are for girth measurement taken "Over bark".
- For **Debarked logs**, the rates shall be increased by 10%.
- For **Axe dressed timbers**, the rate shall be increased by 50%.
- For **Sawn timbers in the form of beams, scantlings and planks**, the rates shall be increased by 100%.

Definition of Firewood for the purpose of Royalty: For the purpose of Royalty, firewood is defined as wood under 1.5 m in length and up to 0.60 m in girth, unsuitable wood of higher dimensions, if found, due to hollowness, crookedness, and other defects of sawing in to scantlings and planks, may be removed as firewood after splitting.

III. GST/ VAT/Other Taxes on Forest Produce:

GST/ VAT or any other tax at the prevailing rates as fixed by the Government from time to time shall be levied on royalty of the forest produces. In the case of sale of the forest produce, GST/ VAT or any other tax shall be realised on the sale proceed of the product.

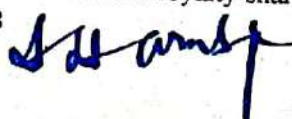
IV. Permit and Transit of Forest Produce:

1. Permit for extraction of forest produces shall be issued by the authorised Forest Officer only in accordance with the prescription of approved Working Plan of the Forest Division.
2. Transportation of forest produce shall be allowed only after due permit for such transportation of forest produce is obtained as mentioned in para IV-1 above and transit pass has been issued by the authorised Forest Officer.

3. Levy of Transit Pass (TP) fee:

For transportation of forest produces from different sources to various destinations, the following Transit Pass Fee as appropriate *in addition to the royalty* shall be charged:

- a) Transit Pass fee @ 60% of the royalty shall be charged for transportation of forest produce of Manipur origin to outside the State within the country.
- b) Transit Pass fee equivalent to 7% of the Custom Assessed Value shall be realised for the forest produce imported inside the State. In absence of the Customs Assessed Value of Forest produce imported without Customs Clearance, Transit Pass fee at double the royalty rate of the forest produce shall be realised.
- c) No Transit Pass fee shall be realised for re-transportation of imported forest produce outside the State within the country provided it has already been realized once at the time of import in the State from Myanmar.
- d) Transit Pass fee equivalent to 10% of the royalty on the forest produce shall be charged for forest produce transported/entered inside the State from another State(s) of the country.
- e) Transit Pass fee equivalent to 5% of the Invoice value of the goods shall be charged for transportation of finished and processed products viz. Veneer, Plywood, Block-board, Furniture Items, Wood Powder, Oil, Handicrafts, Artefacts, etc outside the State.
- f) Transit Pass fee @5% of royalty on forest produce for transportation of forest produce originated from Private lands/Non-forest lands registered with the concerned Divisional Forest Officer (DFO) along with a valid "Certificate of origin" issued as per Manipur Forest Rules by the concerned DFO. No royalty shall be charged in such



cases. However, in case of transportation without the valid "Certificate of origin" duly issued by the concerned DFO, full amount of royalty along with TP fee shall be charged.

- g) In case, a NWFP as listed in para II (h) of this Notification is transported to Manipur without valid documents from other States of the country, following penalty will be applicable:

- (i) Double rates of royalty i.e. royalty increased by 100%.
- (ii) 10% TP fee of the total penal royalty.

- h) However, above-mentioned clause g) (i) & (ii) shall not be applicable on following NWFPs and they will be seized and confiscated as per IFA, 1927 and Rules therein:

- V. In absence of a valid permit and transit pass for NWFP other than being transported from other States as mentioned at Para No. IV (3) (g), the rate of royalty shall be increased by 100%.
- VI. **Exempted Agro-Forestry species originating from Private/Non-forest lands:**
No royalty and transit pass fee shall be leviable for tree species exempted and categorised as Agro-Forestry species originating from Private/Non-forest lands (Appendix).
- VII. **Ad - Valorem Royalty:**
For the items of forest produce not listed and for which no rate of royalty has been fixed in the schedule rates of royalty, the Principal Chief Conservator of Forests & Head of Forest Force, Manipur shall fix and notify the royalty @ 12.5% ad valorem of the prevailing market price.
- VIII. This is issued in pursuance of the Cabinet decision taken on 20/09/2022 and the concurrence of Finance Department, Government of Manipur, vide U.O No.8/2022-23/FD(19-P/7), dated 03/11/2022.

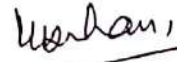
